

Do You Transport Your Cattle and Horses Outside Alberta?

A Livestock Permit or a Special Permit is required
Livestock Identification and Commerce Act (R.S.A. 2006 c. L-16.2)
Livestock Identification and Commerce General Regulation (AR 208/2008)

What You Need To Know

- If you transport cattle or horses to a destination outside of Alberta you must have the livestock inspected and the livestock must be accompanied with either a livestock permit or a special permit - LICA s. 19(1) and LIC Gen Reg ss. 16 and 17.
- Livestock permits and special permits can only be issued by Livestock Identification Services Ltd. (LIS).
- Livestock permits are used to transport one or more animals one time only and expire 7 days after the date of issue.
- Special permits, except lifetime horse permits, are used to transport one or more animals more than once in a calendar year and expire on December 31 of each year.
- Lifetime horse permits are used to transport one horse more than once during the lifetime of the horse or during the time the holder of the permit owns the horse.
